What started out as a routine training mission for the benefit of 129th ARNG personnel flying out of Hill AFB, Utah early last month turned out to be a "Pilot Save" — perhaps the first in which Hayward Guardsmen have taken part.

Capt. Wallace Hurflit, co-pilot, and SMSGt. Robert Singleton, flight engineer,

were crewmembers on board an HC-130 aircraft of the 1550th Airmen Training and Test Wing which, by means of an electronic locator beacon, located a downed light aircraft northeast of Newport, Ore.


